## SHAW ENTERED IN AUTO RACES

### Indianapolis Vet Will Pilot A Frontenac Tomorrow At Rhinebeck Fair

RHINEBECK, Aug. 30.—Ben Shaw, Indianapolis, Indiana, veteran auto race driver, has added his name to the long list of nationally known dirt track and speedway stars who will take part in the AAA, auto race program as the highlight of the closing date feature at the Dutchess county fair, here Saturday.

Shaw, whose feats and exploits on the roaring road has made him famous throughout the nation, will man a Frontenac, racing creation in his local debut at Rhinebeck. The engine is the latest racing product of Arthur Chevrolet, famed engineer and designer of a popular passenger car bearing his name.

Even as good as the Indianapolis driver is known to be, he will face the greatest field of drivers in the coming event he has ever been called on to face. Many of the nation's leading race pilots are entered.

Ted Horn, of Los Angeles, Calif., 1933 Pacific coast champion, another famous entrant was the first of the contingent of drivers to arrive in town. Horn, came in last evening with the car he will man in Saturday's race, and which incidentally he drove to the coast championship. The car will be on display in Poughkeepsie, at a local auto dealer.

Many of the other entrants are expected in Friday, as after the running of the last horse race Friday, the drivers will be able to work out on the track for practice laps and to better acquaint them with the local speedway.

Most all existing track records are expected to be shattered during the running of the auto race events.
