HUNTINGTON TRACK WILL BE SCENE OF TWO RACES SUNDAY

HUNTINGTON, Ind., June 15.—Probably the most colorful lineup of stock car drivers ever shown on the many stock car programs displayed at the local track will be in evidence for the race card scheduled Sunday.

Most of the veteran stock car pilots of other years will be present including Chester Roselle, of Centerville, Ohio; Bud Turley of Kokomo; Virgil Livengood, Plymouth; Bob Roof, Anderson; Earl Peters, Chicago; Bill Priff, Benton Harbor; Gale Lower, Fort Wayne; Joe McCullough, winner of the 50-mile event last year; Charley Engle, Dayton, Ohio, holder of the Winchester stock car record for the half mile.

Much interest will be displayed in Wesley Saegesser, one armed driver of St. Louis, Mo., who has entered. Saegesser's entry is not merely a novelty as a glance at his record shows him to have captured Twenty-one first and three seconds in twenty-four starts. In addition to these entries Art Chevrolet, veteran car builder, will send two Model A's for test trials and, including the better known pilots, about fifty ambitious stock pilots will attempt to qualify at the time trials at ten o'clock. The card will consist of one fifty lap race and one one-hundred lap event and should provide the fans with a real day of entertainment.
