

## MILTON AUTO VICTOR.

### Leads Vail and Chevrolet in 100 Mile Race.

PROVIDENCE, R. I., Sept. 15.—Thomas Milton was the stellar performer in the automobile races at the Narragansett Park Speedway to-day. Milton won the 100 mile race in 71 hour 24 minutes, 42 seconds and the 25 in 19 minutes and 46 seconds. He also got third in the five mile race.

In the 100 mile Vail was a scant 20 yards behind Milton when the latter crossed the tape. Hearn was third.

Vail and Chevrolet followed Milton across at the finish of the 25 mile race and Mulford, Chevrolet and Milton was the order of the finish in the five mile.

In the 100 Mulford and Vail took the lead up to the twenty-sixth mile, when Mulford's rear axle broke, putting him out of the money. Vail kept the lead up to the last turn at the finish of the 100 miles. Milton had been creeping up, but at the ninety-eighth mile Vail led him by one mile. Cutting down this lead the two cars ran abreast down the finish and Milton's burst of speed made him a winner by a scant margin.

Barney Oldfield, who was one of the contestants, drove a slow race and when he dropped out in the ninety-eighth mile he was hopelessly behind the leaders.
